Siskin Hospital opened a brand new Stroke Unit this past spring. The new Stroke Unit is located on the 2nd Floor and features fifteen private rooms. An advanced team of Stroke rehabilitation specialists, including nursing and therapy staff, focus daily on meeting the specialized needs of Stroke patients. We are very excited to have a dedicated unit that will help our Stroke patients on their road back to independence.

the Sky is the Limit



following a remarkable recovery

Trent Creswell is an incredibly talented young man. As a rising senior at the Center for Creative Arts, Trent was excelling as a student, writer, actor, director, singer and dancer. He had been accepted into the summer program at a physical theatre company and was preparing for a future in theatre and the arts.

While enjoying a summer bike ride on June 16, 2008 in the North Shore area of Chattanooga, a speeding Buick hit Trent head-on instantly changing his life forever.

Trent suffered catastrophic injuries, the worst of which was to his face. His mother, Jinger Wadel, described it as though, "Trent was basically broken every way you could be broken. His face was literally ripped off and the bones in his face were crushed. His jaw was broken, he had a broken arm, a broken pelvis, four fractured vertebra, a compound tibia and fibula fracture and right femur... anything that could be broken, except his left arm, was broken."

Trent was rushed to the hospital where after multiple surgeries, he remained in the Trauma Intensive Care Unit in a medically induced coma for two and a half weeks. Upon awakening, Trent began showing signs of recovery. Unfortunately, due to his jaw being wired shut, he was still unable to speak or communicate. So, as a writer, Trent picked up where his mother left off... writing all his thoughts down in a journal.

"I'm a writer, and I sort of live my life through recollections of the things that have happened. And my mom was keenly aware of that. So while I was in a coma, she wrote down everything I did and everything she felt. It's a beautiful journal and it's meant a lot to me in my healing," Trent explained.

Doctors estimated that it could take up to a year for Trent to even be able to walk and that he would most likely miss his senior year of high school. While the diagnosis seemed bleak, Trent arrived at Siskin Hospital with a new hope and a team of caring people to help him on his journey back to the spotlight.

Trent's stepfather, Mike Wadel, explained it as, "You battle that fear of the worst, and you put your faith in hope for a better outcome than anyone ever imagined... and that's what we got."

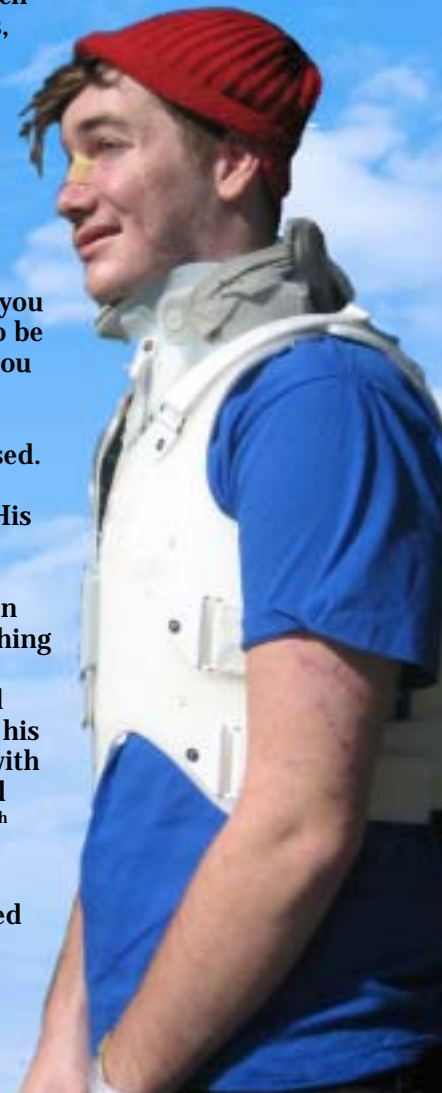
Trent began his therapy and soon surpassed the hopes of everyone by being able to walk again. "You think it's great when you watch your baby take his first steps, but this was the most wonderful experience to watch my nearly 18-year-old baby take those steps," Trent's mother exclaimed.

"It was just very inspiring to have a staff here at Siskin Hospital who are rooting for you so, so much. They want you to get better and they want to be a part of what you do when you get better. They invested so much in me... it's just unbelievable," Trent expressed.

Trent celebrated his 18th birthday at Siskin Hospital. His family, friends and the staff threw him a party where he sampled every type of pizza in the Chattanooga area; something he craved while his jaw was wired shut. Trent's delightful sense of humor also inspired his parents to bring him a cake with a big red Buick and crumpled bicycle that said, "Happy 18th Birthday, Buick Stopper!"

Trent and David Barron, Physical Therapist, developed an incredible friendship

during his stay at Siskin Hospital. David took Trent on "field trips" to a local coffee house and to Trent's home to prepare for his return, ensuring Trent would be safe and comfortable in

his transition back to life outside of the hospital.

Trent's recovery has been nothing short of remarkable. He was able to regain movement and functionality thanks to his hard work and the staff at Siskin Hospital. Trent started his senior year of high school after only missing the first two weeks. He again excelled as a student and artist, using his accident and recovery as motivation for an entire new world of exploring the meaning behind what he views as a beautiful tragedy.

Trent's emotional and humorous journal about his recovery, "Auto-Bike-Ography," won the 2009 National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts (NFAA) Silver Medal Award for Non-Fiction writing, as well as earned him a trip to Miami for youngARTS Week. As Trent explained in his journal, "It is not until you have to be rebuilt that you learn that everything had to be created in the first place.

Through this I have found more strength than I know how to harness, more love than I have enough time to give and gained exponentially more than I have lost. I have been on the spiritual journey to manhood. A ceremonial rite of passage that God thankfully threw me into before I was ready."

Trent is among 141 of America's Best Young Artists selected by the NFAA. He is also one of two Tennesseans chosen as a Candidate for a Presidential Scholar in the Arts Award. He continues to be involved in numerous local productions, including an original play he wrote and directed called, "The Death and Afterlife of Dr. Crash Friendly." Trent was also honored as a 2009 Siskin Hospital "Possibilities" Luncheon Patient Honoree. He will continue to share his artistic talent as he begins his journey as a Theatre Arts major at DePaul University this fall.

His amazing recovery has allowed him to radiantly express himself and expose everyone to a world of those who are also struggling to rebuild their lives after a tragedy or illness. "I have found a community in the sick and the injured. Come down to Siskin Hospital and sit with me for a while. These are beautiful people. This is my posse," Trent explained.

Trent's feelings towards Siskin Hospital were eloquently expressed as, "Siskin Hospital is a very, very special place. It's not many places that you go to after a life-threatening injury where you can say, 'I had an awesome time there.' That's a rare thing and Siskin Hospital was absolutely that for me. I think about this place as a happy place."

Megan Morris was admitted to Siskin Hospital at age 13. She was diagnosed with Transverse Myelitis, which is inflammation of the spinal cord. This inflammation caused Megan to have numbness and muscle weakness. She was unable to walk and move the way she previously did, and as a result, she needed multiple therapy sessions to help her regain her strength and movement.

Megan was so touched by the care she received at Siskin Hospital, that she decided to donate some of her own money to help other patients without adequate insurance receive the care they need. Megan sacrificially gave the donation, because she was so grateful for the difference Siskin Hospital made in her life. She worked with therapists who helped her regain movement, and ultimately her life. Amazingly, Megan was able to walk out of the hospital with assistance.

fitness tip *for summer*

Don't let the summer heat get you!! With temperatures on the rise, it is important to be cautious when exercising outdoors. Heat exhaustion and heat stroke are two dangerous conditions that can occur when exercising in a hot environment.

Some signs and symptoms to look for include nausea and vomiting, headache, dizziness, rapid pulse, difficulty breathing, absence of sweating and confusion. Stop exercising immediately if you experience any of these symptoms.

In effort to avoid harmful heat illness, be sure to limit the duration of exercise by taking frequent breaks, drinking plenty of fluids (before, during and after exercise), wearing light-weight and light-colored clothing, as well as being aware of the signs and symptoms of impending heat illness. On extremely hot days it may be more wise to conduct your exercise regimen indoors, such as in a fitness center, the mall or your own home.
